Date: 6th-7th June 2010 (Teacher workshop) 8th-12th June (IPY Oslo Science Conference)

Place: Oslo, Norway

Size of the event: 120 teacher participants (3000 + participants in the science conference)

Conditions: Accommodation fully covered (6 nights) + other costs in Oslo (Included local bus fares, Resource book and other materials). Participants

Teacher Conference: During the 2-day workshop:

- 1) Educators will meet and interact with polar scientists who will share their latest research and findings during the IPY.
